

**ISSAQUAH SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 411
KING COUNTY, WASHINGTON
RESOLUTION NO. 1152
EMERGENCY**

WHEREAS, the District has Regulation 3432 – Emergencies which acknowledges school closure in response to a pandemic/epidemic and designates the District Superintendent or a designee to act as a liaison for the school district to ensure the health and safety of students, staff, and the community;

WHEREAS, on February 29, 2020, the Washington Governor Jay Inslee declared a state of emergency in all counties of our state under Chapters 38.08, 38.52 and 43.06 RCW, and directed implementation of the plans and procedures of the state’s Comprehensive Emergency Management Plan in response to the novel coronavirus (COVID-19);

WHEREAS, on March 11, 2020, the World Health Organization characterized COVID-19 as a pandemic;

WHEREAS, on March 13, 2020, the U.S. President declared a national state of emergency and Governor Inslee ordered closure of all public and private K-12 schools in Washington State to contain the spread of COVID-19;

WHEREAS, conducting a public surplus sale is unlawful during the state-wide pandemic emergency and district buildings are closed to the public during the district-wide closure;

WHEREAS, the Washington State Department of Enterprise Services, Surplus Division is closed and cannot accept surplus due to the state-wide pandemic emergency;

WHEREAS, obsolete surplus needs to be disposed of immediately in order to have sufficient space at the May Valley Service Center to store, among other things, equipment, supplies and personal protective equipment (PPE);

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that in light of this state-wide emergency, the Board declares an emergency in which the sale of obsolete surplus equipment, supplies, furniture, vehicles and other district personal property may result in material injury or damage to the public interest of the district. The Superintendent is granted the authority to waive the requirements of RCW 28A.335.180 requiring districts to sell, rent or lease such surplus property to any person, firm, organization, or nongovernmental agency for at least thirty days following publication of notice in a newspaper of general circulation in the school district.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that execution of this Resolution is conclusive evidence of the Board’s approval of this action and of the authority granted herein. The Board warrants that it has, and at the time of this action had, full power and lawful authority to adopt this instrument.
