Security Vestibules & Cameras

Vestibules & Security Cameras

- All District buildings have a vestibule or buzz in system
- Intercom systems at entrances
- Approximately 1650 plus security cameras District wide
- Elementary buildings average 35-55 cameras
- Middle Schools average 60-90 plus cameras
- High Schools average 110 plus security cameras
- All high schools also have vape detectors in selected restrooms with signs posted
- All buildings secured with DNA Fusion program and monitored 24/7 365 for Burglaries and Fire and immediate Security Officer response if needed
- After hour Security camera monitoring for active alarms
- Electronic Key card access and monitoring



Legend ID visitor badges

Each Building Has Visitor ID system

- Legend ID visitor badge takes photo off Drivers License or Passport and requires visitor to wear badge
- Visitor badge only valid for allowed time
- Maintains log of visitors
- Prevents misuse of old style over the counter visitor passes



Communications

Building Emergency Radios

- Each Building is equipped with:
 - An emergency radio for direct contact with Security Director, District Lead Officer or Executive Director Assistants
 - Communications capability to speak with staff on site
 - SL-300 radios for enhanced clarity and coverage areas
- Infrastructure and Systems support for buildings include:
 - Upgraded District Communications added 5 new repeaters at strategic locations for better clarity and coverage
 - District's own radio frequency
 - Semi-annual radio checks



Incident Readiness

Emergency supplies

- Annual Container Checks in progress
- Emergency 10 year water at all sites enough for each student and staff
- Emergency Classroom buckets
- Emergency Backpacks
- Emergency information posters in each classroom and office
- Security Team assists buildings with Monthly Drills



District wide Security

Building and Facility Security

- Daily patrols of District wide Buildings and Facilities
- Weekend, Holiday and Night Patrols
- Continual assessments of Building and Perimeter security
- Collaborate with local Law Enforcement and Fire Departments
- Each Building has their own Emergency Operations Plan tailored to their specific site and needs
- District Executive Emergency Response Team plan (EERT) designed for Superintendent and Cabinet. Contains response plans for several situations such as Earthquakes ,Pandemics ,Air Pollution, Bomb Threats, Intruders on Campus, Fires, etc.
- Tabletop exercises for Executive staff

Security Officers are assigned to the following buildings:

- Cougar Mountain Middle School
- Issaquah Middle School
- Maywood Middle School
- Liberty High School
- Issaquah High School
- Skyline High School
- New Patrol Position / District Lead Security Officer Assists at all buildings within the District



Security Officer Training

Officer Training

- All Security Officers have been trained on the Washington State HB 1214 required topics, such as Constitutional and Civil rights of children in schools, Trauma- informed approaches to working with youth, Child and Adolescent development, Recognizing and responding to youth mental health issues, Educational Rights of students with disabilities, Collateral consequences of arrest and court involvement, De-escalation techniques to name a few
- · AED, First Aid, Narcan, Safe Care, CPR, Stop the Bleed.
- Each Officer carries a Medical "Go Bag" that includes Tourniquets, Medical supplies and bandages
- Each new Officer attends our own advanced Field Training Program of at least 5-7 days, which exceeds the State requirement of three days
- Security Director and Officers attend summer conferences to stay current on best practices and regional District trends
- ISD is a member and collaborates with our local PSESD 121 for training and meetings
- Security Department holds at a minimum, Quarterly training and unit meetings and round table discussions
